

THE CHALLENGE AT HAND

With respect to labour force participation and entrepreneurship, India reports an impressive growth story. However, these improvements do not translate to the economic inclusion and development of women. The participation of women in the workforce is stagnant and expected to decline further. As per the Udyam Registration Portal, women-owned MSMEs constitute a mere 20.5% of total number of MSMEs registered on the portal. Out of every 100 business owners in India, only 7 are women, and this wide disparity displays how pursuing economic opportunities and accessing finance for operating and scaling their businesses become challenging for women. Some of these challenging factors are:



 All the various challenges to women entrepreneurship roughly translate to a singular roadblock in operating a business- a lack of access to finance. Over 70% of the total finance requirement of women entrepreneurs in India is still unmet.³



Addressing the gender gap in financing is crucial for reducing disparities in the entrepreneurial landscape. To achieve this, we are leveraging **RETURNABLE GRANTS** (**RGs**)- an innovative financial instrument that provides short-term, affordable, and flexible capital to individuals. **SRIJAN-** our micro-lending program tailored for women micro-entrepreneurs looking to scale their business in the Indian unorganized sector, utilizes RGs to facilitate easier access to credit.



Our goal with Srijan for the financial year of 2024-2025 is to empower women-led businesses by providing returnable grants to 1000 micro-entrepreneurs from the informal sector, and you can help us get there!



IMPACT SO FAR

Since 2022, we have provided funding through returnable grants (RGs) to support microenterprises led by women, in collaboration with various corporate partners and foundations.



Driven by an ethical commitment, the micro-entrepreneurs honored the repayment of RGs. Full and final repayment was seen as a moral duty that would enable the empowerment of another businesswoman in need of an RG. This successfully perpetuated a cycle of empowerment and inclusion. Current trends indicate that a RG creates a 5-7x multiplier effect on social impact over the years, making it a potentially catalytic tool to propel economic growth and gender equality.

During the pandemic, Varsha's husband experienced unemployment, placing her in the role of the sole provider for a family of five. Upon receiving a returnable grant of ₹ 20,000, she enhanced her home-based beauty salon (operating from her front porch) by investing in new equipment. This grant facilitated the expansion of her services and improved marketing efforts for her establishment. Varsha successfully repaid the grant within the designated six-month timeframe. Presently, she earns up to ₹ 25,000 monthly and serves 25-30 regular clients. Additionally, she has established a cosmetic store for her husband to manage and initiated a savings account for her children.

Apart from facilitating the lending process and creating access to finance, Youvati supports women entrepreneurship by providing a platform for upskilling, marketing & business tools, and networking opportunities.
